Who can be a volunteer?

You can be a volunteer no matter

• where you come from



• how old you are



• what your ability is.

You can be a volunteer with disability.



You can also be a volunteer if English is **not** your first language.



You only need to

• have time



• enjoy helping others.

What skills do you need?



Skills means what you are good at. For example, cooking.

Everyone has a skill that can help others.



Maybe you are good at

• talking to people



• making people smile



• looking after animals.

You do **not** need special skills to be a volunteer.

What can you do as a volunteer?

There are many types of work for volunteers.



Sports

You can help out at your local sports club.



Arts and craft

You can make things for others.

For example, knit blankets for homeless people.



Community care

You can help to deliver food to people in need.



Nature care

You can help a local bush care group. For example, plant trees.



School

You can help out at your local school. For example, help children with homework.



Animals

You can care for animals that need help. For example, rescue dogs.



Health

You can volunteer at a hospital. For example, to guide visitors.



Why should you be a volunteer?

You will **not** get any money when you volunteer.

There are other good reasons to volunteer.

Good reasons to volunteer can be

• it gets you out of the house



• you make new friends



- you will help the community
- you can learn about other cultures





• you can learn something new.

• it feels good to help others
